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Dear Branch President,

I hope to see many of you at Convention. If you have to miss the April 20-22 event in Winston-Salem, please consider asking a proxy to represent you at the Friday evening board meeting. This proxy can be someone from another branch. If you won't be at the Saturday business session, someone else in your branch may be the delegation chair at the business meeting on Saturday, and your branch is allocated additional delegates based on the number of members as of February 1. Every branch gets at least two votes at the AAUW NC convention (the branch president/delegation chair and one additional vote for every 25 members or major fraction).

We depend on the branches to help set the direction for AAUW NC, and this is done primarily at the board meetings. As an example, there have been few applications for the mini-grants. As a branch president, you have a voice at the AAUW NC board table where decisions are made on how to spend AAUW NC money. We are also looking for volunteers to be nominated for election to the 2007-2008 nominating committee – those who will find candidates for membership vice president and secretary for 2008-2010.
